



Primary PE Sport Grant at Burnt Tree Primary School 2015-16

What is Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £450 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14; 2014/15 and 2015/16 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding.

This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

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How do we plan to spend the money?

- Improve the quality of teaching of PE with a focus on games and athletics in KS2.
- Deliver high quality gymnastics to all pupils Y1-Y6 through use of professional coaches
- To increase the range of sports available to pupils at Burnt Tree Primary School.
- To increase the variety of sports clubs available to pupils after school.
- To increase participation in inter-school competitions
- To increase the proportion of pupils who can swim 25 metres by the end of Year 6

Updates:

1.	Four KS2 teachers have benefitted from release time/team teaching activities with the head of PE from a local academy school. As a result the teaching of PE is securely good across Key Stage 2.
2.	RB sports have been delivering gymnastics sessions to all pupils and delivering an after school club to pupils in KS1. They are also running a gifted and talented club at lunchtime.
2a.	Mark Bennett delivers high quality games lessons to upper KS2 throughout the year and provides a table tennis after school club.

3.	Since September 2015 pupils have been able to attend multi sports, cricket, football, table tennis, gymnastics or dance after school clubs.
4.	This academic year pupils from Burnt Tree will train for and perform in a gymnastics competition at a local primary school.
5.	This academic year pupils in Year 3, 4 5 and 6 will have lessons at the local pool.
